

San Luis Obispo Campus Public Safety: The newly renovated 7500 building is now the home of the Campus Police Department. The scope included reconfiguration to create offices for the Chief and Sergeant, an officer squad room, dispatch office, parking enforcement office, training room and Emergency Operations Center (EOC), and secured evidence room. The building received new interior and exterior paint, carpet, exterior signage and lighting, security system and cameras, gated cruiser and golf cart parking, along with parking lot ADA upgrades.

A Message from the CBOC Chair

The Measure L Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee is pleased to report significant progress on projects funded under the voter approved Measure L. The committee has the responsibility to verify to the best of its knowledge and belief that Measure L Bond revenues have been spent only for the purposes identified in Measure L.

The committee relies heavily upon the Independent Auditor's Report of financial statements, as well as a Performance Audit Report performed by certified public accountant firm, CWDL. The 2022 Fiscal Year-End financial statements for Measure L were given a clean, "no financial statement findings or questioned costs," recommendation, and the performance audit testing indicated the San Luis Obispo County Community College District has properly accounted for expenditures held in the Measure L Bond Fund and that such expenditures were made for authorized Bond projects.

This annual report lists many projects completed and underway using Bond funding as provided by the First Issuance of Measure L Bond funds of \$75 Million in March 2015, the Second Issuance of \$73 Million in January 2018, and the Third Issuance of \$70 Million in February 2021. One final Bond Issuance will occur in 2024. The projects have been essential to both the San Luis Obispo and North County Campuses and the results are outstanding.

The future looks bright for the San Luis Obispo County Community College District with facilities improved to provide a quality education and life experience for all students who choose to enroll at Cuesta College. The contribution of Cuesta College to the county is enormous and the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee is proud to be part of this most beneficial program.

The San Luis Obispo County Community College District Measure L Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee wishes to report that, to the best of its knowledge and belief, the Cuesta Community College District is in full compliance with the responsibilities described in Article XIIIA, Section 19b0930 of the California State Constitution.

Thank you for your continued support of Measure L and your interest in the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) 2022 Annual Report. This annual report provides a summary of how local taxpayer money is being spent and details the progress Cuesta College has made with regard to its promise to the citizens of San Luis Obispo County.

The District has been successful in completing significant projects despite the continued product delivery delays post-pandemic. Improvements to the North County campus included the campus courtyard and signage and wayfinding. Roofing and HVAC repairs and upgrades, electrical switchgear replacement, technology upgrades, and signage and wayfinding all occurred on the San Luis Obispo campus, and completion of the design and approval of the Campus Center. This addition to the San Luis Obispo campus, scheduled to begin in Spring 2023 under the third issuance, will be the "front door" to the campus and provide a centralized location for student enrollment services, administrative services, conference rooms, a cafe, and spaces for students to gather.

Cuesta College continues to support student success through its improvement of District facilities, increasing our ability to provide a safe and modern learning environment for all students. Ballot Question

To repair, construct/acquire facilities, sites/equipment, prepare students/returning veterans for universities/good paying jobs, address severe budget cuts by updating aging classrooms, improving/maintaining nursing, paramedic, 9-1-1 medical training, welding, engineering, automotive, early childhood education/other career education programs, repairing deteriorating gas/electrical lines, upgrading technology, shall San Luis Obispo County Community College District issue \$275,000,000 in bonds at legal rates, requiring citizens' oversight, independent audits, all funds used locally?

SLOCCCD Measure L General Obligation Bond Under the Provisions of State Proposition 39

San Luis Obispo County residents voted on November 4, 2014 to approve Measure L - Cuesta College affordable education, job training and campus repair Bond, a \$275 million general obligation bond. Funding from the bond helps the college modernize technology, upgrade the failing infrastructure of decades-old classrooms and labs, and build new teaching and learning spaces.

After voter approval of Measure L, the College Board of Trustees established the Measure L Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) appointing seven members of the community to provide objective oversight of District bond fund expenditures.

The role of the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee is to determine whether or not the use of the funds is consistent with the original bond measure, inform the public on District expenditures of bond proceeds and to publish an annual report of the year's Measure L activities for taxpayers of San Luis Obispo County Community College District.

Independent Auditor's Financial and Performance Audits

Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2022

he Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee received the Independent Auditor's Report for the financial statements of the general obligation bonds of the San Luis Obispo County Community College District, as well as a Performance Audit report on the uses of bond monies, for the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. The reports were prepared by certified public accounting firm CWDL.


The Independent Auditor's Report states:

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the San Luis Obispo County Community College District's (the "District") Measure L General Obligation Bonds and the related notes to the financial statements as of and for the year ended June 30, 2022, as listed in the table of contents. In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Measure L General Obligation Bonds of San Luis Obispo County Community College District, as of June 30, 2022, and the changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The Performance Audit states that the objective is to:

Determine that the District expended Measure L General Obligation Bond funds for the year ended June 30, 2022 only for the purposes approved by the voters and only on the specific projects developed by the District's Board of Trustees, in accordance with the requirements of Proposition 39, as specified by Section 1(b)(3)(C) of Article XIIIA of the California Constitution.

Conclusion: The results of our tests indicated that, in all significant respects, San Luis Obispo County Community College District expended Measure L General Obligation Bond funds for the year ended June 30, 2022 only for the specific projects developed by the District's Governing Board and approved by the voters, in accordance with the requirements of Proposition 39, as specified by Section 1(b)(3)(C) of Article XIIIA of the California Constitution.



About SLOCCCD

San Luis Obispo County Community College District (SLOCCCD) is a small-sized rural single college district that offers instruction and student support services as Cuesta College at three locations: the San Luis Obispo Campus, the North County Center, and the South County site. In addition to serving as locations that offer instructional programs and student services, Cuesta College hosts various public events, recreational activities, and community education programs.

Technology Planning & Implementation Update

During the 2022 calendar year, the Information Technology Department kicked off its AV upgrades program by constructing mock-up rooms which included new flooring, paint, acoustical ceilings, LED lighting, whiteboards, flat panel displays, and audiovisual systems.

In addition, the last phase of the San Luis Obispo campus's fiber project was completed with the installation of single-mode fiber from the Data Center to the County Office of Education building across Highway 1.

Finally, Districtwide analog phone line demolition and upgrades were conducted. This scope included the removal of inactive and outdated telephone equipment which was selectively replaced with new life safety and emergency systems.

Electrical Switchgear Replacement

The electrical switchgear serving the 5000s and 6000s complexes are nearing the end of life and in the process of being replaced. This work began in the Fall of 2022 and is approaching substantial completion. Due to equipment lead times, this project is being executed in two phases. The first phase will prepare for the new switchgear, while the second will consist of the actual equipment installation. This installation is planned for Winter break 2023. The electrical switchgear for the 4000s complex will also be replaced. This project is currently in design and will be submitted to the Division of State Architect (DSA) in the upcoming months.

Restroom ADA Upgrades

During the 2022 year, restrooms were renovated in buildings 4000, 4100, 4200, 4300, 4600, 5100, 6100, 6200, and 7100. Restrooms were demolished to the studs and completely rebuilt with new District standard appliances and finishes.

Roofing & HVAC Replacement Projects

Re-roofing and HVAC replacement occurred on the 2500, 4000, 6100, 6300, 7100, and 9100 buildings. All new single-ply roofing, HVAC equipment, ductwork, roof drains, exhaust fans, and controls were installed at each location. In the 3rd issuance, the roofing and HVAC equipment for the 5000s complex will also be replaced.

SLO Aquatics Bleacher & Storage

To provide a more accessible spectator area, the bond team procured and installed a new 5-row, 61.5-foot long set of bleachers. Storage buildings were also erected to help with pool deck organization and safety.





Your Measure L Dollars at Work!

North County Instructional Building

During the 2022 calendar year, the bond team, with support from the stakeholder committee, began to develop the schematic and conceptual design of the new North County Campus Instructional Building. The building is 9,600 square feet with an open area of 8,391 square feet for potential future expansion. The interior consists of instructional spaces, storage rooms, student and staff restrooms and locker rooms, as well as a workroom. This new structure will also tie into the recently completed courtyard. The project is currently in the design document phase with a planned construction start date of Spring 2024.


3000s Complex Tenant Improvement

Currently in the programming phase, the reconfiguration and tenant improvements of the 3100/3200 and 3300/3400 buildings will commence once the SLO Campus Center project is complete. The 3100/3200 building will be the sole home of the San Luis Obispo Campus's Student Programs and Library, while the 3300/3400 building shall serve as the Math Lab, Student Success Center, and Transfer/Career Department.

Signage & Wayfinding

The Measure L Bond Team is actively implementing the District's new signage and wayfinding program. The program is separated into five phases and includes new vehicular directional signage, pedestrian directories and directional kiosks, and building signage. One phase is complete; two are in construction, one is bidding, and the last is under DSA review. The entire signage and wayfinding program is expected to be completed by the end of the 2023 calendar year.
