




The Anthropology program has increased enrollment over 2015-2016 academic year (N=4). The percentage in our department's change is 0.78% compared to the College's 1.83% change. When compared with Anthropology's -10.00% drop from 2015-2016, the department has a significant increase. The only full-time faculty member participated in Cuesta College's Promise Days in an effort to increase enrollment and interest in Anthropology. She also gave presentations in the Forum to perspective students about <u>all</u> Social Sciences courses offered at Cuesta College.


Also, courses with zero class limits are excluded from this measure.

The overall College fill rate is 83.85% for 2016-2017 academic year and Anthropology's fill rate is 79.78%. This is an increase in the program from the previous academic year 2015-2016 of 5.22%.

The Anthropology department offers DE classes, diverse class times, and North County Campus courses. The course offerings fit into a variety of student schedules. The only full-time faculty member (Lise Mifsud) participated in Cuesta College's Promise Days in an effort to increase enrollment and interest in Anthropology. She also gave presentations in the Forum to perspective students about <u>all</u> Social Sciences courses offered at Cuesta College.




Student Success Rates for face to face modality are 51.67% and for online modality are 76.92%. This is an unusually high number for online modality. The face to face success rates are due to instructor policy of student responsibility for dropping. To increase student success in ANTH

201 (Life Science Transfer- Area D1), an embedded tutor has been utilized for 2018. Next year's CPPR results will be interesting.

Although there has been a slight decrease in the percentage of student course completion over the past two years, it is unlikely that this is a significant trend and it may reflect the rotation of courses offered at the various campus sites. Faculty (full-time and adjunct) continue to have discussions about student success. Many faculty attend the California Community College Anthropology Teacher's Association to discuss pedagogy, student success, new topics in anthropology, textbooks, and teaching tips. Many of us belong to list-servers that solicit feedback from others in the field about classroom activities, syllabi, textbooks, study guides, best practices and effective videos ("Teaching College Anthropology"). We also have an embedded tutor who started this semester (spring 2018) in Physical Anthropology.


