Best practices in education and facilitation in the post-Covid-19 have been adopted by the Criminal Justice Program. Online classes are still being offered while the in-person learning class modalities have been updated. The in-person classes have returned to a traditional two-day class week offering greater interaction, facilitation, and learning opportunities between the students and instructor. The dual credit courses have added an additional class. In addition to teaching CJ 101 (Introduction to Criminal Justice), Templeton High School will also be presenting CJ 206 (Concepts in Criminal Law).



A. General Enrollment




Enrollment: Duplicated count of students who completed greater than 0 units in positive attendance courses or were present on census for all other accounting methods.

The program experienced an 8.55% enrollment decrease in the years 2023-2024, while the college saw a 6.19% increase over the same reported years (2023-2024).

The decline is consistent with the national overall trend in the industry being experienced including California and San Luis Obispo County. Administrators in the industry agree that recruitment and retention are of the highest priorities and challenges facing this profession.

B. General Student Demand (Fill Rate)




The college fill rate rose by over 3% and the Criminal Justice fill increased by 1.67% for the 2023-2024 period. The Criminal Justice fill rates per class were examined on an individual basis. The fill rates for 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 were compared and reviewed for growth or shrinkage.

Data interpretation: The 2022-2023 comparison to 2023-2024 revealed some data that should be considered for future scheduling with consideration to schedule convenience and availability for both our in-person and distance learners. The results column reflects possible reasons for student decline within some sections. The above reasons/notes column includes possible contributing factors to student decline for some classes.

Program response: To increase student enrollment and engagement, in-person modalities have returned to a traditional in person two-day college session. To address the enrollment decline in CJ 224 (the CJ224 Course is required for both programs AA&AST), the class is now being offered in-person and online to reach a wider range of students; students who prefer in-person, while still offering an online class for our distant learners. A summer class has also been proposed beginning Summer 2025.

C. General Efficiency (FTES/FTEF)




College efficiency for 2023-2024 is 11.55 and for the Criminal Justice Program is 13.75. The Criminal Justice program saw a 2.2% increase from the previous reported period and remained above the overall numbers reported by the college.





The College's face to face classes reported 79.81% while the Criminal Justice Classes were reported at 60%. The Criminal Justice saw a 7.57% drop from the previous reported year. The online classes for the College were reported at 73.47% and the Criminal Justice classes reported 73.6%. The online classes experienced a 1.14 increase in enrollment.





The success rate for the 2023-204 reported year for the College was 76.69% while the Criminal Justice success rate was 68.19%.

The performance gaps for all reported student subpopulations met or were at the College goal with the exception of our Hispanic students. The Hispanic students were 6.91% below the College goal. While the numbers must be improved, they do reflect an improvement from the previous year's gap of -8.44%. The college overall reported -5.01 deficit for Hispanics students.

The Criminal Justice Program has added an additional section of CJ224-Community, Diversity and the Justice System, a class that promotes equity inclusion and fairness in Criminal Justice, allowing students to join the conversation and propose positive change for the industry. Additionally, this class was only offered online, it is now an in-person class to allowing for greater engagement and involvement by our students in addressing inequities and gaps within our communities.
