



General Enrollment







General Efficiency (FTES/FTEF)




ECE has consistently out preformed the college in efficiency. It is important to note the



Successful Course Completion by Student Subpopulation







• ECE is clearly doing better with the 25-60+ than the rest of the college. This has less to do with efforts on our part but on the nature of the ECE field.
