Adding to the already impressive selection of classes offered, History faculty are excited to add the following to the program in the near future: 1. Creation of a student-run History Club. Professors McKiernan, Highhouse and DeFraga have held student interest meetings and hope to see such a club up and running before long. 2. Creation of a Public History component to the department. Professor McKiernan is spearheading this effort, and has been instrumental in placing history majors in internships throughout the County. 3. There is also the likelihood of adding a Global Studies course to the college which would most likely be taught by history faculty. 4. The addition of a Dual Enrollment history course to be offered at Mission Prep.





History enrollment was up by 61 students in the 2017-2018 Academic Year, over the previous year. This the highest number of enrollments in five years. Compared to the College as a whole, History enrollments are .8% higher than the College total. History faculty are diligent about promoting classes offered each semester, and the Department offers a wide variety of courses. Both factors contribute to the enrollment increase. Other contributing factors include: increased DE offerings, more courses offered at the California Mens' Colony, the revival of History 212 after a two-year absence, and the continued impact of the History ADT.



While History fill rates decreased 12% between the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 Academic Years, the difference between the program and the College is much smaller. The College fill rate for the 2017-2018 year was 81% and the History Department saw a 79% fill rate for the same year. One factor that must be considered is that class caps for History courses are often higher than those found in other college departments. Fill rate statistics therefore, are not always going to be as accurate.

An analysis of the Department of History's FTES/FTEF compared the Overall College's FTES/FTEF for the 2017-2018 Academic Year demonstrates the numerical/ratio difference between 16.55 and 12.88, respectively.

That is, the Department of History is 3.67 FTES/FTEF higher that the Overall College.


Importantly, this is a continuation of a positive trend; that during the five academic years since 2013, the Department of History has maintained a higher FTES/FTEF than the Overall College.

The five-year average for the Department of History's FTES/FTEF is 17.64, while the Overall College's is 13.27, demonstrating an average difference of 4.47 over this time period.


The Student Success-Course Modality measures both Face-to-Face and Online modalities.


To the first, the Successful Course Completion for the History Department's Face-to-Face modality for the 2017-2018 Academic Year is 75.08%, while that of the Overall College is 76.88%, reflecting a difference of 1.8%.

To the second, the Successful Course Completion for the History Department's Online modality for the 2017-2018 Academic Year is 76.17%, while that of the Overall College is 71.37%, reflecting a favorable difference to the History Department of 4.8%.

Taken together, the average of two modalities of the History Department and the Overall College show 75.62% and 74.13%, respectively. This suggests that, on average, the History Department's Student Success rate is 1.5% higher than that of the Overall College.



Successful Course Completion by Student Subpopulation








Successful Course Completion by Student Subpopulation





Regarding curriculum, the History Department hopes to start offering the History 203 and History 204 series out of sequence in DE modality. This would allow students, especially History majors, to have more flexibility in meeting all their course requirements. For example, a student could take History 203B in the fall semester, without having to wait until the spring. Regarding the Global Studies ADT, history faculty are considering teaching one or more of the courses in that degree program.
