





However, while not part of this data set, we have seen a significant decline in enrollments for the current year 2018-2019 and expect to see this decline in next year's data. The reason why the program saw an increase in the enrollment numbers was do to a very strategic marketing program to get students to enroll. However, without a full-time faculty member who understands the program, this is unlikely to happen again.











This chart is extremely misleading. There are nine Paralegal courses offered at Cuesta. The first, PLGL 131, has shifted to be offered ONLY online, so it is impossible to distinguish if the success is due to any particular change in the way the course is offered. PLGL 201, 203, 207 are only offered in person and PLGL 205, 206, 208, 209, 220 also shifted away from face to face to only online offerings. So unfortunately, this speaks more to the overall success between courses than between the modalities of online vs face to face.






Success: The Percentage of student enrollments resulting in a final grade of "C" or better



There is a 20-point success gap between low income and not low-income students.



Of particular concern is the gap between White students and Black students, there is a 29-point gap in success. This is very troubling. However, part of this is likely due to the fact that there are far fewer Black/African American students who enroll in these courses and this leaves a lot of variability in the outcome. This gap is much smaller for the Legal course, as shown in the graphs on the next page.
