	Effectiveness of Previous	For outcome number 7, it is not surprising that students did not report that the objective is met because		
	Improvement Plans	they were not required (per the old degree pattern) to take the Introduction to Corrections course.		

		Now that the Introduction to Corrections course is required, that number should increase.  As for outcome No. 8, it is tied to the Investigative Report Writing class, which was also not required of students until the Spring 2012 semester catalog. In the survey, students were directed not to answer the question unless they had taken the course, which resulted in 4 responses instead of 11. If in fact those four students took the class, only half agreed the outcome was met. This could be attributable to this being the first time the course has been taught. No changes to curriculum should be implemented based solely on the opinions of 2 students. However, this should be monitored closely to make sure changes do not need to be made.
6	Recommended Changes & Plans for Implementation of Improvements	No changes at this time but a close eye will be kept on the report writing class.
7	Description or evidence of dialog among course or program-level faculty about assessment plan and results	The lead instructor disseminated the survey analysis to all part-time criminal justice instructors. She will then contact part-time faculty to discuss results and obtain input, observations and suggestions regarding program improvement areas. In addition, this subject will be a standing topic at the annual criminal justice instructors meeting.
