

Common Tags in Adobe Acrobat

Element Description	Associated Adobe Tag Codes	Use/Description
Title or Subtitle	<H1>, <H2>, <H3>, <H4>, <H5>, <H6>	Use <H#> tags for text that is a title of a document or title of a subsection of the document.
Text/paragraphs	<p>	Use the <p> tag for text and paragraphs that are the body of the document and are not a title or subsection.
Table of Contents	<TOC>, <TOCI>; <Reference>, <Link>	Use <TOC> to identify if there is a Table of Contents. Use <TOCI> for every item listed in the Table of Contents. As with Lists, if there is a sub list of items you will need a <TOC> tag for every level with nested <TOCI> tags. If the Table of contents is linked, you will need to ensure the <TOCI> tag has a <Reference> tag containing a <Link> tag.
Lists	<L>, 	Use <L> as the parent tag for the List. Use as the child tag for every item in the list. Each new sub list will need a new <L> tag at the new level with nested tags.
Links	<LINK>, Link- OBJR	Use <Link> for all links in the document. The Link-OBJR will contain the hyperlink information.
Tables	<TABLE>, <TR>, <TH>, <TD>	Use <TABLE> to identify tables. Use <TR> to identify each row of the document. Use <TH> to identify headers in rows and/or columns. Use <TD> to identify the content in each part of the table (content that is not a header).
Image	<FIGURE>	Use <FIGURE> to identify images in the document.
