Cuesta College offers two Dual Enrollment programs for high school students: High School Enrichment Program and CCAP Program. Dual Enrollment students may participate in both the Enrichment and CCAP Programs in a term.

Dual Enrollment applies to students in Grades 9-12 who are concurrently enrolled at Cuesta College while in high school

Enrichment Program Overview

- Students participate in Cuesta College classes **outside** in their high school timeframes*
- Enrollment Fees waived
 - Health Fee, Parking, Student ID, Textbooks, and Instructional Materials fees are not exempt.
- Courses are a part of a particular pathway:
 - Advanced Scholastic coursework
 - Vocational coursework

*Exception: Mission College Prep

Enrichment Opportunity: Innovation Section Development

- Dual Enrollment Office Collaborates with High Schools to Request Innovation Sections
 - Way to articulate and capture request for demand from high school students
- Courses Open in ClassFinder the day Enrichment Students Can Register

Cuesta College Course Scheduling to Serve PRHS Innovation Academy Students

Background:

Cohorts of students, based on grade level, opt to participate in PRJUSD's "Innovation Academy" to be on track to complete one year of college prior to graduation from high school. While working with a high school counselor, students participate in a mixture of CCAP and Enrichment classes. To provide strategic access to Cuesta College courses, PRHS has requested the following courses to be offered annually in the Spring and Summer schedules as "Innovation" sections (opening for registration the day Enrichment students can register in myCuesta to provide greatest access to the course for Innovation Academy students). Dual Enrollment student Instructional Materials will be paid for through the collaboration.

CCAP Program Overview

- Students participate in closed Cuesta College classes **during their high school day** in their high school period
 - Simultaneously represents high school and college credit
 - Student receives transcript for both
- Completely Free
 - No campus-based or Instructional Materials fees
- Courses are a part of a particular pathway:
 - Career and Technical Education
 - Preparation for Transfer
 - College and Career Readiness

CCAP Legislation

76004.

Notwithstanding Section 76001 or any other law:

(a) (1) The governing board of a community college district may enter into a College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) partnership with the governing board of a school district or a county office of education for the purpose of offering or expanding dual enrollment opportunities **for pupils who may not already be college bound or who are underrepresented in higher education**, with the goal of developing seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education or preparation for transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or helping high school pupils achieve college and career readiness.

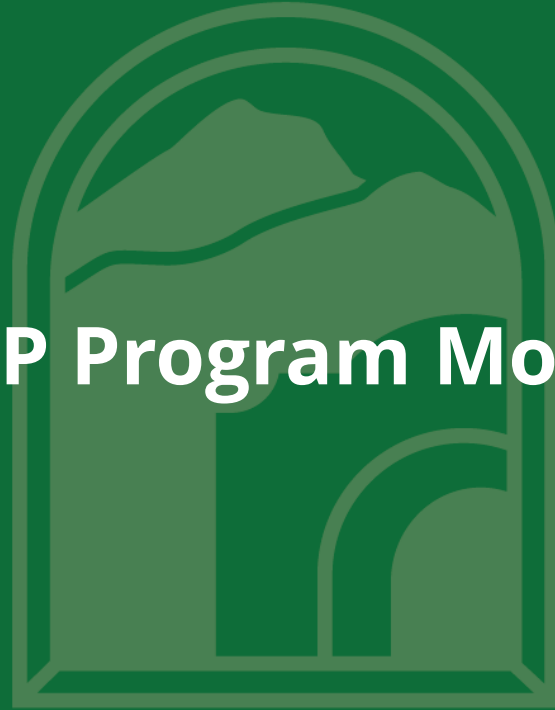

CCAP Model – HS Teacher Led (85%)

- High School Teacher meets Min. Quals and has an approved Curriculum Review determined by Faculty Designee*;
- Instructor of Record in Cuesta System
 - Submit Course Syllabus
 - Submit Census Roster
 - Submit Grades
 - CCAP Enrollment Support
- Course goes through annual course evaluation process with Cuesta Faculty Designee*
- Instruction paid for by HS District
- District and High School Teacher Stipend Model

 - Course Scheduled as 16-week, 18-week, or year-round (August to end of Spring term)
- Instruction paid for by Community College District

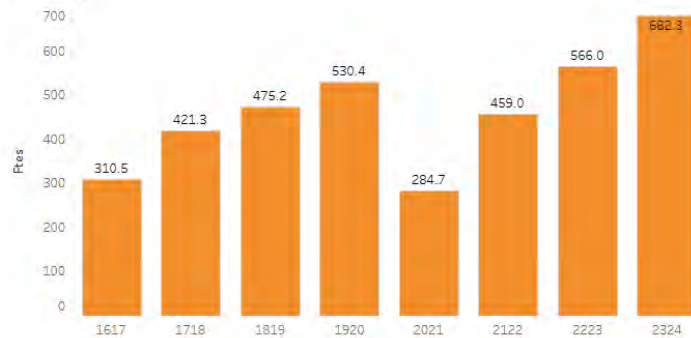

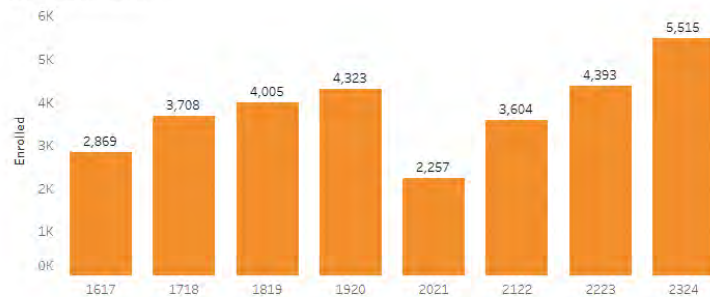

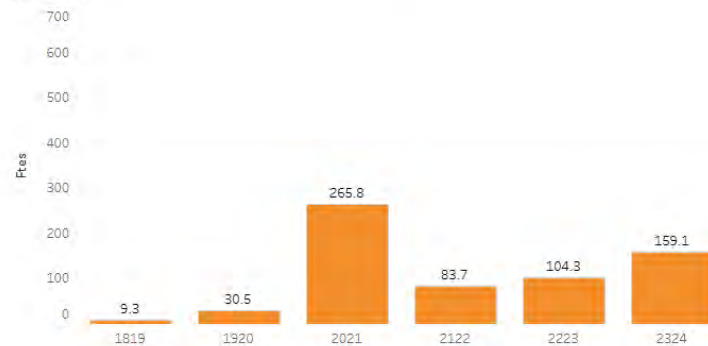
CCAP Enrollments



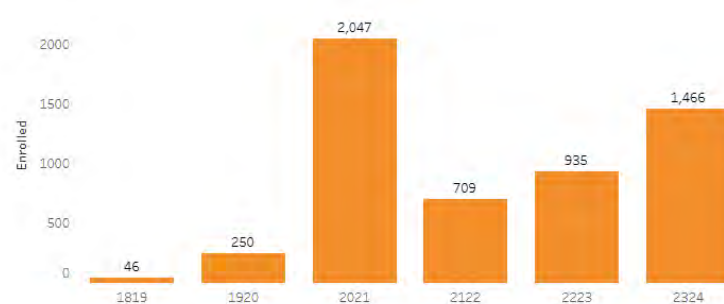

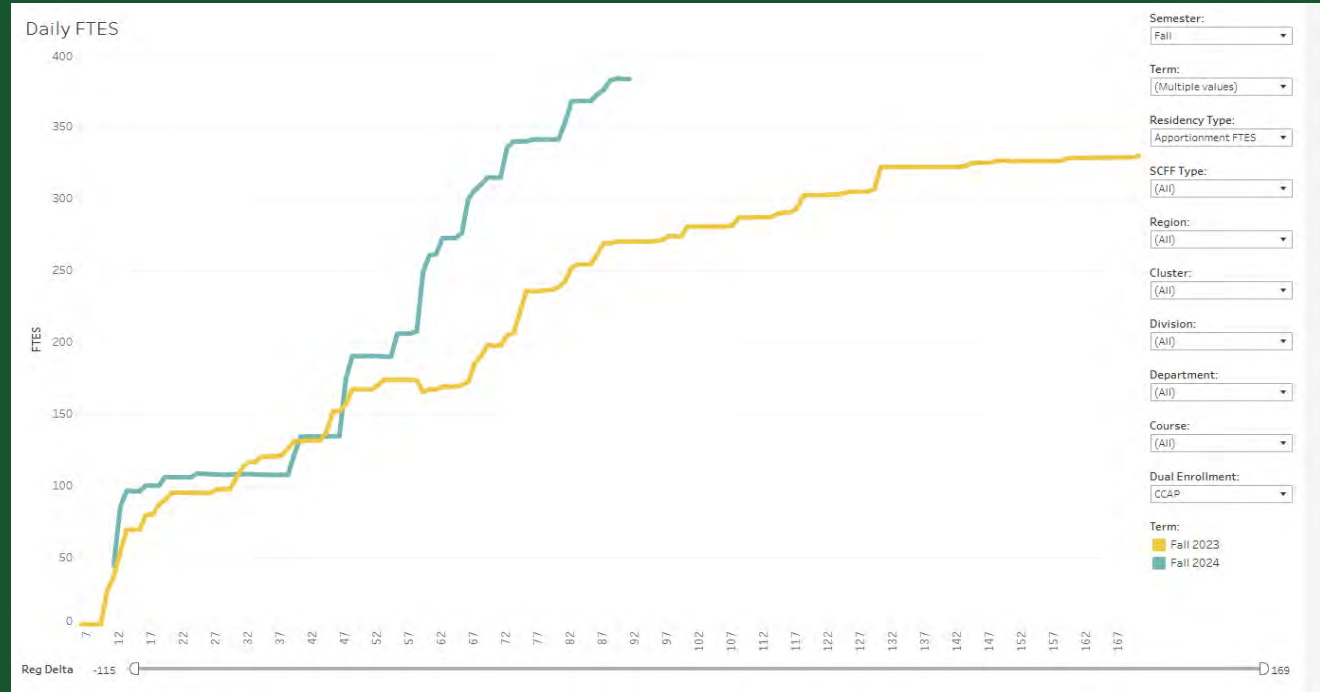
