PREPARING FOR YOUR NEXT STEPS

Whether you recently obtained your GED certificate or are close to completion, it is important to start planning your next steps.

As a GED graduate, you may be eligible for the Cuesta Promise, a scholarship program that will pay for any fees during your first year enrolled in credit courses.

Complete these steps before August 1st, 2025 to receive the **Cuesta Promise**:

- **CHECK RESIDENCY CLASSIFICATION**
- (The Cuesta Promise will pay fees for students that are a California Resident or AB540 student)
- 2 SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION
- 3 FAFSA/DREAM ACT APPLICATION
- **A** CUESTA ONLINE ORIENTATION
- 5 UPDATE MAJOR IN CUESTA PORTAL
- 6 REGISTER FOR CLASSES
