This letter is to inform you of some important details prior to starting the **Spring 2019** online class. Please read this page carefully!!

Course Overview

This course offers a practical look at proper approaches and techniques used to understand, utilize and troubleshoot workplace technology-- particularly computer and multimedia technology found in various Library workplaces.

Class requirements

Each student should have access to the World Wide Web, a broadband connection is recommended.

Each student should also have basic computer experience including, using email and a web browser, experience with an LMS (Learning Management System) is preferable.

Web Browser: For Macintosh, Safari FireFox, or Google Chrome. For Windows, Microsoft Internet Explorer 6.0 or above is required. For Internet Explorer, version 6 or 7 is recommended. Additionally Firefox works fine on Windows.

Computer Specs: Macintosh or Windows computer with at least a 1 Ghz processor speed. Also, you should have a minimum of 1 GB of system RAM (memory).

Word Processing program: A recent version of Microsoft Word or other word processing software is required for composing your assignments. If you use a word processing program other than Microsoft Word, if you do use Word the default .doc or .docx is acceptable but also I will accept Rich Text, .rtf.

Flash plug-in: Adobe Flash plug-in is a free download needed only if you are running an older browser, IE 4 and earlier for

example. The Flash player is included in all current web browsers (IE 6 and 7, FireFox 1 through 3 and Safari).

Adobe Acrobat Reader plug-in: This is a free plug-in that enables you to read certain course readings.

Operating System: Mac Users: Macintosh with OS 10.9 minimum, OS 10.11 is recommended. PC Users: Windows 7 minimum and Window 8 or 10 is recommended.
