1. Academic degree, license or relevant certificate held by applicant. *Points are awarded in ONE of the following categories only. Maximum points = 10*

1a. Associate's degree or higher	10	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Official, sealed transcripts from regionally accredited U.S. colleges or universities, with degree awarded by the application due date. Cuesta transcripts do not need to be submitted. Transcripts must show degree awarded if points are to be applied in this category.
1b. Licensed Health Care Worker: (LVN, Psych Tech, Paramedic)	8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Copy of current California license with license number, date issued, and expiration date. Expired or out of state licenses cannot be accepted.
1c. Certified Nurse Assistant Certification plus CNA work experience (500 hours in past 2 years)	8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Copy of current California CNA certificate with certificate number, date issued, and expiration date, PLUS "Work or Volunteer Experience in Healthcare Verification" form and Employer Letter. Expired or out of state licenses cannot be accepted.
1d. Certificated Health Care Worker: (Nurse Assistant, Medical Assistant, Phlebotomist, EMT)	6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Copy of current California certificate with certificate number, date issued, and expiration date. Expired or out of state licenses cannot be accepted.

2. Grade point average in relevant coursework. GPA cannot be rounded. *Maximum points = 50*

<p>2a. Combined Prerequisite Science GPA: (Anatomy, Physiology, Microbiology)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Minimum 2.50 <i>combined</i> GPA required and no less than a "C" in any course (GPA cannot be rounded). ➤ Points are calculated by multiplying the combined GPA by 10: i.e. a combined GPA of 3.64 x 10 = 36.4 pts. ➤ During Spring 2020 only, due to the COVID 19 outbreak, online sciences will be accepted, and grades of "Pass/No Pass" will be excluded from this formula. 	<p>Combined Science GPA of 2.50 or higher x 10</p> <p>(Maximum 40 points)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Official, sealed transcripts from regionally accredited U.S. colleges or universities, showing course completion by the due date. <p>GPA calculator: http://www.cuesta.edu/student/counseling/tools.html</p>

<p>2b. Combined English <u>AND</u> Math GPA: (English Composition and Associate Degree Math requirement*)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ No less than a "C" in either course. ➤ Points are calculated by multiplying the <i>combined</i> GPA by 2.5. i.e. a combined GPA of 3.64 x 2.5 = 9.1 pts. ➤ Because this category requires a <i>combined</i> English and Math GPA, applicants who have successfully completed English, but have not met the math requirement will not earn points in this category. <p>*The current Associate's Degree math requirement is Intermediate Algebra, but may vary depending on catalog year. 3. Work or volunteer experience. *Maximum points = 5*

<p>3b. 200 hours or more volunteering in healthcare or a nonprofit organization, within the last 2 years</p>	2.5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Volunteer Experience in Health Care or a Nonprofit Organization Verification Form • Previous volunteer experience is no longer valid. All volunteer experience must be submitted on the current form with this application to be considered.

4. Life experiences or special circumstances. While more than one of the following criteria may apply, only 2.5 points can be awarded in this category. Maximum points = 2.5

Need to work - student worked at least part-time while completing RN prerequisite course(s).	2.5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One paycheck stub from the semester you worked while enrolled in RN prerequisite course(s), or a letter from your employer verifying employment on official letterhead.

5. Proficiency in languages other than English. Applicant may be proficient in more than one additional language but only 2.5 points can be awarded in this category. Maximum points = 2.5

Applicant must have the ability to speak, interpret, and write in the language at a conversational level as well as be able to translate in the healthcare setting. The person verifying language ability may not be a relative or family member. Applicants claiming proficiency may be asked to verify this through assessment testing at Cuesta College.</p>

6. Diagnostic assessment tool (ATI TEAS). *Minimum points = 3, Maximum points = 30*

<p>ATI TEAS Assessment Point Allocation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 62% is the minimum accepted score. Applicants with a Total Score below 62% will become ineligible and must meet with the Cuesta College RN Success Specialist to complete a remediation plan to become eligible to apply in a future application cycle. Applicants with an Overall Score between 62% and 65% will receive the minimum score of 3 points in this category. Applicants with an Overall Score between 92% and 100% will receive the maximum score of 30 points in this category. All other applicants will subtract 62 from their Overall Score to calculate their points, i.e. an Overall Score of 90% = 28 points awarded (90-62=28). 	<p>Overall Score - 62 = Points Awarded</p> <p>(Minimum of 3 points; Maximum of 30 points)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ATI TEAS assessment test transcript (score) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If you test at Cuesta during the current application cycle, your ATI TEAS assessment score is automatically received, and no other documentation is required. If you do not take the ATI TEAS assessment test at Cuesta, you must request to have Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI) send your Official ATI TEAS transcript (score) to Cuesta. ATI TESTING The ATI TEAS assessment test must be taken with each application cycle. Refer to the timeline specified in the Application Instructions. Your first ATI TEAS assessment score within the past 12 months is the only score that can be accepted. No online testing will be accepted. Note: The ATI TEAS will continue to be the required version for this application cycle. Be advised that next year, 2022, the updated TEAS 7 will be required.
