

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE ASSOCIATE DEGREE REGISTERED NURSING (RN) PROGRAM

Apply September 2025/Program start August 2026/Complete May 2028

Online applications accepted September 2, 2025 at 9:00 am through September 30, 2025 at 4:00 pm

Admission criteria is subject to change from year to year. It is the applicant's responsibility to meet current requirements and due dates.

The Cuesta College RN program is approved by the California Board of Registered Nurses (BRN). The program prepares students to graduate with an associate degree in nursing (ADN). Graduates are eligible to take the National Council Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN), leading to licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN).

Class selection follows the multi-criteria screening process in accordance with California Education Code 78261 and the California Community College Chancellor's Office.

- Points are awarded in the areas of academic performance; work or volunteer experience; proficiency in a language other than English; life experiences or special circumstances; and a diagnostic assessment test. The points awarded in each of these categories are explained in the point allocation section of these application instructions.
- Program admission is offered to the highest scoring eligible applicants to fill available seats. If there is a tie among applicants, a computerized random selection will break the tie.
- There is no wait list for the RN program. Applicants not admitted to the program must reapply in a future application cycle.
- Cuesta College RN program licensure exam pass rates are listed at:

- Conviction of a misdemeanor or felony may constitute grounds for denial of licensure. Meet with the Director of Nursing to discuss any concerns before applying to the program.
- A Cuesta College ADN to BSN collaborative pathway is available through CSU Monterey Bay with classes offered in San Luis Obispo.

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. Prerequisite coursework must be completed and grades posted on transcripts prior to applying. Must have a combined GPA of 2.50 or higher in Microbiology, Human Anatomy, and Human Physiology. No grade lower than a 'C' in any of the prerequisite courses.

- Online science labs are not accepted, unless completed Spring 2020-Spring 2022.
- "In Progress" prerequisite courses are not accepted.
- Grades of 'C minus' and below are not accepted in any prerequisite coursework.

Please note: 5-point deduction is taken for each repeat in a prerequisite course earning a substandard grade of C-, D+, D, D-, F, FW, NP, or NC. **Three (3) or more repeats in prerequisite coursework due to substandard grades results in program ineligibility** (see Appeal Situations page 5).

- To convert quarter credits to semester credits (Quarter credits X .667 = Semester credits).

2. Completion of ATI TEAS Test (Version 7) taken between November 1, 2024 and October 31, 2025. Official score must be submitted no later than October 31, 2025.

- Only the first test score in the timeframe can be accepted.
- Minimum accepted score is 62%.

3. Official completed transcripts from ALL non-Cuesta colleges attended submitted by application deadline.

- Must be from regionally accredited US colleges or universities.
- Transcripts submitted previously showing in-progress coursework must be resubmitted when the course is completed to be considered eligible.
- International transcripts must be formally evaluated.

4. Additional Required Coursework completed by July 31, 2025

- **Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) Required Courses for licensure**

Important -BRN Licensure courses may not be waived for any reason and must be completed with a grade "C" or higher.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. [Apply for admission to Cuesta College.](#)

- You will receive a Cuesta College student ID number and Cuesta email address when you apply to Cuesta.
- Assure your my.cuesta.edu email address is current and active throughout the application cycle. All communication regarding your nursing application and admission status will use your Cuesta email. No personal emails can be used.

2. Submit ALL official transcripts to Cuesta College Records Department

- Submit official transcripts from All Non-Cuesta Colleges/Universities and AP College Board.
- Transcripts must be received at Cuesta College by the nursing application deadline. No exceptions, so submit early.

3. Prerequisite coursework equivalency evaluation.

- Students are strongly encouraged to have their non-Cuesta RN prerequisite coursework evaluated for equivalency to Cuesta College prerequisite courses prior to submitting their application. To do this, first submit all transcripts, then schedule an appointment with a [counselor](#). You must have a Cuesta College student ID number to schedule a counseling appointment.

- If you're unable to have your non-Cuesta RN prerequisite coursework evaluated by a counselor before the application cycle, you are still able to apply. Your non-Cuesta coursework will be evaluated during the selection process as long as your most current, official transcripts are on file by the application deadline.
- Prerequisite coursework taken at other colleges must be approved as equivalent to Cuesta College prerequisite courses. Do not assume a class is equivalent because it has been accepted by another nursing program.
- To convert quarter credits to semester credits (Quarter credits X .667 = Semester credits).

4. Complete and submit the online RN application, including all supporting documentation by the application deadline.

- Upload your supporting documents with your online application. ***All documents uploaded to the application must be saved in PDF format.***
- Upon successful submission, a confirmation email with an application summary will be sent to your Cuesta email account. This notification confirms the receipt of your application only and does not reflect program eligibility or acceptance into the program.
- Review the application summary to verify application is complete and all attachments are uploaded and open successfully.
- If you do not receive a confirmation email within 24 hours after submitting your application, or your supporting document attachments do not open, it is your responsibility to contact NursingAdmissions@cuesta.edu to verify the status of your application before the application deadline. Inquiries after the application deadline cannot be considered, and you will need to reapply in a future application cycle.
- Print and save a copy of your application and confirmation number for your record.

5. Take the ATI TEAS assessment test.

- ATI TEAS (Version 7)
- Test within the timeframe of November 1, 2024-October 31, 2025.
- Create an account with atitesting.com.
- Register for a TEAS test (See grid below for explanations on the testing options available).
 - Through atitesting.com (If testing online or in-person at PSI testing center)
 - Through [Cuesta Nursing Website](https://cuesta.nursingwebsite.com) (If testing in-person at Cuesta). Dates and registration link will be available on the nursing website in September.
- Submit official TEAS transcript. Deadline to submit official score is October 31, 2025.
- Applicants must test with each application cycle. Only the first test score within the timeframe above will be accepted. TEAS assessment scores submitted outside of the timeframe will not be accepted.
- A total score of 62% or higher is required for program eligibility. A completed remediation is required for any TEAS score lower than 62%, now or previously, in order to be an eligible applicant. If this applies to you, email NursingAdmissions@cuesta.edu to request remediation information or provide evidence of a successful remediation. **NOTE:** If you test within the timeframe above and score below 62%, and then remediate, you are still ineligible to apply for this application cycle.

Missed deadlines due to non-receipt of emails cannot be accommodated. If email notifications *have not* arrived in your my.cuesta.edu mailbox by the dates provided, you must email: NursingAdmissions@cuesta.edu within 2 days.

7. Complete courses to meet Cuesta College's Associate Degree General Education requirements and BRN required courses.

If not completed prior to applying, these must be completed by July 31, 2026. If not completed by this date, your space in the program will be forfeited and you will need to reapply in a future application cycle.

8. Updating your contact information

If there have been any changes to your name, address, email, or phone number after submitting your application, you must update this information immediately by emailing to: NursingAdmissions@cuesta.edu . Updating your information in myCuesta Portal will not update your nursing program application.

INELIGIBLE APPLICANT SITUATIONS

Applicants are **INELIGIBLE** for admission in the following situations:

- Failure to submit **ALL** official sealed non-Cuesta transcripts for by the due date.
- A combined prerequisite science GPA of less than 2.50, with no rounding. [GPA Calculator](#)
- A grade less than 'C' in any prerequisite.
- Prerequisite courses not meeting equivalency to Cuesta College prerequisite courses.
- Three or more repeats in the prerequisite courses earning grades of C-, D+, D, D-, F, FW, NP, or NC.
- Prerequisite coursework not taken at a regionally accredited U.S. college or university.
- International courses not formally evaluated by ACEI or NACES member.
- Coursework not posted by the deadlines in this application.
- Failure to meet the ATI TEAS requirements.
- Incomplete or in-progress applications.
- Failure to meet deadlines and/or respond to time-sensitive emails.
- Any hold on your Cuesta student account.

Appeal situations for prerequisite courses:

- Ineligibility due to 3 or more prerequisite courses with substandard grades.
and/or
- Point deduction(s) due to prerequisite coursework with substandard grades. A separate appeal is to be submitted for each course.
 - The Appeal Request Forms can be found in this packet or on the nursing program website.
 - To receive credit for appeals from previous application cycles, your approved appeal decision letter must be uploaded with this application.
 - Supporting documentation, as appropriate, is required to validate your appeal.
 - Appeal Decision letters will need to be saved by the applicant. It highly recommended to save a hard copy and a digital copy of your Appeal Decision letter for the future use. The nursing department cannot save these for you.

The intent of awarding points in the work experience category is to recognize relevant work experience that would allow students to be well-prepared for success in the RN program. Work duties that facilitate knowledge, understanding, and experience with the RN role, the RN-patient relationship, and the practice of skills in the human healthcare setting may be considered.

The following work experiences are examples of work experience that would be considered for points.

- LVN, medical assistant, nurse assistant, paramedic, and psychiatric technician positions
- Multidisciplinary teamwork that includes collaboration with an RN
- Patient health & hygiene, vital signs, feeding, daily living, mobility/transfer techniques

Note:

Student Nurse Assistant (SNA) hours will not be considered (paid or unpaid).

Personal caregiving positions in private homes without a business license are not able to be considered.

Phlebotomy alone in a clinic doesn't qualify but may count if the job involves collaboration with RN's or LVN's in a healthcare setting.

Work experience is evaluated on a case-by-case basis, and points are not guaranteed.
