

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE ASSOCIATE DEGREE REGISTERED NURSING (RN) PROGRAM beginning Fall 2021 and completing Spring 2023

Online applications accepted October 1, 2020 at 8:00 am through October 31, 2020 at 4:00 pm, 2020

Admission criteria is subject to change from year to year. It is the applicant's responsibility to meet current requirements and due dates.

The Cuesta College RN program is approved by the California Board of Registered Nurses (BRN). The program prepares students to graduate with an associate degree in nursing (ADN).

Graduates are eligible to take the National Council Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN), leading to licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN). RN program licensure exam pass rates are listed at: www.rn.ca.gov/education/passrates.shtml.

Class selection follows the multi-criteria screening process in accordance with California Education Code 78261 and the California Community College Chancellor's Office.

- Points are awarded in the areas of academic performance; work or volunteer experience; proficiency in a language other than English; life experiences or special circumstances; and a diagnostic assessment test.
- Program admission is offered to the highest scoring eligible applicants to fill available seats. If there is a tie among applicants, a computerized random selection will break the tie.
- There is no wait list for the RN program. Applicants not admitted to the program must reapply in a future application cycle.
- Conviction of a misdemeanor or felony may constitute grounds for denial of licensure. Meet with the Director of Nursing to discuss any concerns before applying to the program.
- A Cuesta College ADN to BSN collaborative pathway is available through CSU Monterey Bay with classes offered in San Luis Obispo.

- Course equivalency information for coursework not taken at Cuesta College can be found in the Application Instructions, Step 3 of this packet.
- Online science labs are not accepted. Exception: courses taken online during the Spring and Summer 2020 COVID 19 outbreak will be accepted.
- A combined GPA of 2.50 or higher is required for the 3 science courses, with no rounding.
- Grades of 'C minus' and below are not accepted in any course
- 3 or more repeats in prerequisite coursework due to grades of C-, D, F, I, U, W, and F result in program ineligibility.

2. ATI TEAS Assessment Test Score (Test of Essential Academic Skills), with a total score of 62% or higher, taken between December 1, 2019 and November 30, 2020, and submitted no later than December 1, 2020.

- Only the first test score in the timeframe above can be accepted.
- Although 62% is the minimum accepted score, scores of competitive candidates have typically ranged above 80%.

4. Additional Required Coursework completed by August 1, 2021:

The following courses may be taken after your application is submitted, but must be completed before program entry.

a. Cuesta College Associate Degree General Education Required Courses*:

*Applicants with a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution *may* be able to waive the General Education courses listed above. See a counselor to determine if this applies to your situation.

*RN Licensure courses may not be waived for any reason.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

2. After submitting your application, a **Cuesta student email account and student ID number will be emailed** to you. These will be necessary to complete the application and to receive email communication about your application status. Personal emails cannot be used for communication regarding your RN application.

4. **Determine course equivalency for prerequisite courses not taken at Cuesta College:**

 - For courses not listed, contact a Cuesta counselor for advice on submitting a *Pre-RN/Pre-LVN Course Equivalency Form*.
 - Courses not pre-determined for equivalency, will be evaluated as part of the application process and results will be communicated to applicants in their eligibility letter.
5. **Request official, sealed transcripts, from ALL colleges attended and submit them to Cuesta College Enrollment Services by the application deadline:**

6. **Complete and submit the online RN application, including all supporting documentation by the application deadline:**
 - Applications must be submitted online. No printed applications will be accepted.
 - The link to the online application is accessible on the RN program website during the month of October.
 - The year at top of the online application must match the year you are applying, or your application will not be recognized in the applicant pool.
 - Upon successful submission, a confirmation email will be sent to your my.cuesta.edu email account. This notification confirms the receipt of your application only and does not reflect program eligibility or acceptance into the program. Print and save a copy of your application and confirmation number for your record.
 - If you do not receive a confirmation email within 24 hours after submitting your application, it is your responsibility to inquire about the status of your application by emailing: nursingadmissions@cuesta.edu. Inquiries after the application deadline cannot be considered and will need to reapply in a future application cycle.
7. **Take the ATI TEAS assessment test between December 1, 2019 and November 30, 2020, and submit test score to Cuesta College by December 1, 2020:**
 - Only the ATI TEAS assessment test will be accepted.
 - A total score of 62% or higher is required for program eligibility. Although a TEAS assessment score of 62% is the minimal score accepted for eligibility, scores of competitive applicants have typically ranged above 80%.
 - Applicants must test, or retest, with each application cycle during the timeframe above. TEAS assessment scores outside of the timeframe above cannot be accepted.
 - Cuesta College offers one complementary ATI TEAS assessment test to program applicants during each application cycle. If you have already taken the TEAS assessment test within the timeframe above, only the first test score can be accepted, and you are not eligible for the complimentary testing at Cuesta.
 - If you test at Cuesta College during the current application cycle, your ATI TEAS assessment score is automatically received, and no other documentation is required.

- If you do not take the ATI TEAS assessment test at Cuesta College, you must request to have Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI) send your Official ATI TEAS transcript (score) to Cuesta College.
- Remediation is required for a score lower than 62%. If this applies to you, email to: nursingsuccess@cuesta.edu to request remediation information.

Missed deadlines due to non-receipt of emails cannot be accommodated. If email notifications *have not* arrived in your *my.cuesta.edu* mailbox by the dates provided, you must email: nursingadmissions@cuesta.edu within 2 days.

- **January 6, 2021:** Notification of appeal status. All appeal decisions are final.
- **January 13, 2021:** Work experience, volunteer experience, and language point decisions. It is your responsibility to follow the instructions in this email and respond to any discrepancies by **January 20th**. Responses received after this due date cannot be considered.
- **February 3, 2021:** Point allocations and eligibility notification will be emailed. It is your responsibility to follow the instructions in this email and respond to any point discrepancies by **February 10, 2021**. Responses received after this due date cannot be considered.
- **February 24, 2021:** Notification of admission status and alternate pool ranking will be emailed to all eligible applicants.

9. Submit Cuesta College Associate Degree and BRN required coursework: If not submitted with your online application these must be completed by August 1, 2021, prior to program entry. If not submitted by this date, your space in the program will be forfeited and you will need to reapply in a future application cycle.

INELIGIBLE APPLICANT SITUATIONS

Applicants are INELIGIBLE for admission in the following situations:

1. A combined GPA of less than 2.50, with no rounding, in the science prerequisite courses, or a grade less than 'C' in any prerequisite.

2. Three or more repeats in the prerequisite courses due to grades of C-, D, F, I, U, W, & FW.
 - If you are ineligible due to excessive repeats, you may appeal this status by submitting the Ineligibility Status Appeal Form located on the RN program website.
3. Failure to submit all official, sealed transcripts for coursework completed from all colleges and universities attended, other than Cuesta, by the due date.
4. Failure to meet the ATI TEAS requirements.
5. Incomplete or in-progress applications.
6. Failure to meet deadlines and/or respond to time-sensitive emails.
7. Any hold on your Cuesta student account.
