

## **AP 4050     Articulation**

The process of articulation includes developing a formal, written and published agreement that identifies courses on a "sending" institution that are comparable to, or acceptable in lieu of, a specific course requirement at a "receiving" institution. Successful completion of an articulated course assures the student and the faculty that the student has taken the appropriate course, received the necessary instruction and preparation, and is ready to progress to the next level.

The Superintendent/President of the San Luis Obispo Community College District, working in collaboration with the college's articulation officer and Office of Instruction, shall establish articulation agreements with baccalaureate programs, other post-secondary educational institutions and high schools as appropriate.

The agreements shall assure appropriate articulation of the District's educational programs and address the District's designated responsibility and processes for the development, maintenance and distribution of the aforementioned articulation agreements. These articulation agreements shall be set forth in detail on the Cuesta College website. The college articulation officer shall:

- Serve as a member on the college Curriculum Committee;
- Serve as a resource to faculty in the curriculum development process;
- Submit annual curriculum changes to the University of California and California State University systems for acceptance of transfer credit;
- Submit new and revised course outlines to University of California and California State University systems for inclusion into general education agreements;
- Initiate and maintain articulation agreements with public and independent baccalaureate institutions within and outside the State of California as appropriate;
- Submit new and revised course outlines to baccalaureate institutions for course-to-course articulation;
- Update ASSIST to reflect Cuesta College curriculum changes as appropriate See
