

Pathways presented will include: The Human Development/Human Services (HDHS) AA is an interdisciplinary degree in Applied Behavioral Sciences. This degree concentrates in psycho-social development across the life span with emphases in identity development, the family system, and human services. The HDHS AA prepares students to transfer or pursue a paraprofessional career in human services, such as parenting coach/educator, support counseling, and crisis management.

Addiction Treatment Studies Program includes an AA and certificate designed to prepare students for future careers in the growing field of drug and alcohol counseling.

Social Work and Human Services ADT emphasizes the application of behavioral sciences within a variety of cultural contexts. As a profession, Social Work and Human Services focuses on methods for helping people from many different social groups to improve the quality of their lives.

Social Justice Studies ADT is an interdisciplinary program with a focus on equity and social change, preparing students for seamless transfer into Ethnic Studies, Gender Studies, Social Justice Studies, and related majors in the CSU system.
