Important Information!

CHANGES to CCPG Fee Waiver: Starting Fall 2016, you must meet “Academic & Progress Standards” to remain eligible for CCPG!

- **Academic Standard – Sustain a 2.0 GPA or higher:** If your cumulative GPA falls below 2.0 for two consecutive primary terms (fall/spring semesters or fall/winter/spring quarters), you may lose CCPG eligibility.
- **Progress Standard – Complete more than 50% of your course work:** If the cumulative number of units you complete is not more than 50% in two consecutive primary terms, you may lose CCPG eligibility.
- **Combination of Academic and Progress Standard:** Any combination of two consecutive terms of cumulative GPA below 2.0, and/or cumulative unit completion of not more than 50% may result in loss of CCPG eligibility.

How Do I Know If I May Lose Eligibility? You will be notified within 30 days of the end of each term if you are being placed on either Academic (GPA) and/or Progress (Course Completion) Probation. Your notification will include the information that a second term of probation will result in loss of fee waiver eligibility. After the second consecutive term of probation, you may lose eligibility for the fee waiver at your next registration opportunity.

How Do I Regain Eligibility?

1. Improve your GPA or Course Completion rate to meet the “Academic and Progress Standard.”
2. Successful appeal regarding “Extenuating Circumstances:”
 - a. Verified accidents, illness or other circumstances beyond your control
 - b. Changes in economic situation
 - c. Evidence of inability to obtain essential support services
 - d. Special consideration factors for CalWORKS, EOPS, DSPS and veteran students
 - e. Disability accommodations not received in a timely manner
3. Not attending your school district for two consecutive primary terms (fall/spring semesters, or fall/winter/spring quarters)

FOSTER YOUTH: Foster youth & former foster youth (age 24 or younger) are not subject to loss CCPG under these regulations.

California College Promise Grant waives enrollment fees only. You may qualify for additional money to help with books, supplies, food, rent, transportation, and other costs by completing the application that applies to you:

1. **For US citizens and eligible non-citizens (i.e. permanent residents)**, complete the **FAFSA** (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) application at www.fafsa.gov.
2. **For AB540 students (as determined by Cuesta)**, complete the **CAL DREAM** Application at www.dream.csac.ca.gov.

AB 1899, chaptered in September of 2012, provides for a non-resident enrollment fee exemption for “Victims of trafficking, domestic violence and other serious crimes”. In addition, the legislation allows these students to apply for and, if eligible, receive financial aid from programs administered by public postsecondary institutions or the state of California. Finally, the legislation provides that enrollment fees shall be waived for these students who apply for and are eligible to receive Board of Governor enrollment fee waivers.

AB 801 provides assistance to homeless youth by reducing barriers to college attendance.

California Domestic Partner Rights and Responsibilities Act extends rights, benefits, responsibilities and obligations to individuals in domestic partnerships registered with the California Secretary of State under Section 297 of the Family Code. If **you** are in a Registered Domestic Partnership (RDP), you will be treated as an Independent married student to determine eligibility for this Enrollment Fee Waiver and will need to provide income and household information for you and your domestic partner. If you are a dependent student and your parent is in a Registered Domestic Partnership, you will be treated the same as a student with married parents and income and household information will be required for your parent and his/her domestic partner.

CCPG Methods (i.e. ways to qualify):

- A. Receiving assistance** from government programs such as TANF/Cal Works, SSI, SSP, and/or General Assistance.
- B. Meeting the income standards**

CALIFORNIA INFORMATION PRIVACY ACT
