Keynote Speaker: Dr. Melissa Moreno attended college at the University of California where she majored in Women's Studies and Sociology and has been working as an Ethnic Studies Professor for fifteen years.

Moreno is the Chair of Ethnic Studies at Woodland Community College and Founder of the California Community Colleges Ethnic Studies Faculty Council.



She has a history of advocacy starting with Native and student of color advocacy and participation in many associations and community organization boards. Is an active member of the California Latino School Board Association, National Association for Chicana and Chicano Studies, and Liberated Ethnic Studies to promote racial equity and inclusion.
